

## Cambria Cup final 2021

The final will be on Sunday 21/11/21 at 1100. The director will be Sarah Amos. The four teams will be captained by Kurbalija, M Pierce, Murphy and C Pierce. One out of Kurbalija and M Pierce is undefeated so will start with a 2.5% bonus of the total victory points available to his or her team.

The event will be run on RealBridge and links will be sent to the captains by late on Thursday or (hopefully) earlier. This links will also be published on the WBU website on the Cambria Cup page.

Please make your team aware that this event uses self alerting with no screens, so alerting and explaining is done by the player making the call, similar to BBO, and further questions should be referred to that player via private chat.

There will be a round robin of 5 board matches followed by a round robin of 5 board matches with a 45 minute break in between followed by a round robin of 5 board matches after a short break. The first session of 15 boards will finish at about 1245 and the second session of 15 boards will start at 1330. The second session of 15 boards will finish at about 1515 and the third session of 15 boards will start shortly afterwards. It is expected that the event will finish by 1720. The director can adjust the timings if necessary and will instruct the players if so.

Players should sit in their agreed partnerships at their allocated table by 1050 and these partnerships will be unchanged for the first session. They should then change partnerships in time for the second session at 1330. The third change of partnership is at 1515 after the second session. Teams of more than four may only change personnel after 15 and 30 boards. No pair may ever play in more than one session and a man and a woman must always be playing at any time. Whenever a player leaves a table to be replaced they should press Leave.

The rules of the Cambria allow players to be added up to a maximum of six at this stage. It would be helpful if additional players be notified to the organiser before the final giving their WBU (or EBU) numbers.
